Dear LIS Professionals,

LIBRARY SPACE FOR LEARNING AND READING:

Learning means gaining knowledge, and reading means absorbing facts. Learning is an active cognitive process, while reading is a passive process of learning words and collecting information. These activities have taken place in libraries for centuries because libraries preserve history, culture, and universal knowledge.

Traditional libraries had wooden tables and chairs, a reading room for women, a reference section, a periodicals section, and reading

rooms for postgraduate students. It is unlikely that all libraries had identical layouts. Once upon a time, if you put your legs on another chair, your library card was confiscated for one week, and you were denied entry to the library, as if it were a major crime.

Libraries nowadays incorporate design, sustainability, and green concepts into new ecosystems. Readers enjoy more freedom in the reading areas of modern libraries. This scenario has changed drastically; libraries have moved from bare-minimum wooden or plastic furniture to comfortable chairs, sofas, and well-designed tables.

Change is a continuous process that we cannot stop. Observing patterns and behavioral changes in how readers use library spaces is one way to anticipate future needs. Disrupting existing seating arrangements indicates that change is required; this may be due to group learning, case studies, or projects. Each library is a good case study for a librarian, as they observe the day-to-day happenings and movements taking place before their eyes. Accordingly, all libraries must adapt their spaces to be more dynamic rather than static, maintaining a proportion based on the active and

passive learning styles adopted by their institutions.

Library users visit to update their knowledge, which is a broad objective, but if we delve into details, one finds many reasons: clearing doubts, adding value, achieving better grades, improving future prospects, securing better placements, finding business opportunities, or producing research. There is a strong relationship between reading and pedagogy. Active and passive learning methods impact how library spaces are designed. Passive learning encourages isolation or individual reading, while active learning encourages collaboration. This necessitates discussion rooms for two to eight readers, makerspaces, and varied zones, such as quiet areas and relaxation areas, to help users regain energy. Libraries also require small classrooms for information literacy programs and faculty-student interactions. Modern library setups must differ from traditional designs.

Parallel systems have developed to support reading culture and meet the requirements of competitive examinations and remote work. Limited space in small homes, the work-from-home concept, and the pressure of competitive exams have increased the demand for study space. Since this is not possible for everyone, reading rooms and the use of public gardens and cafe culture for reading, meeting, and working are increasing in popularity.

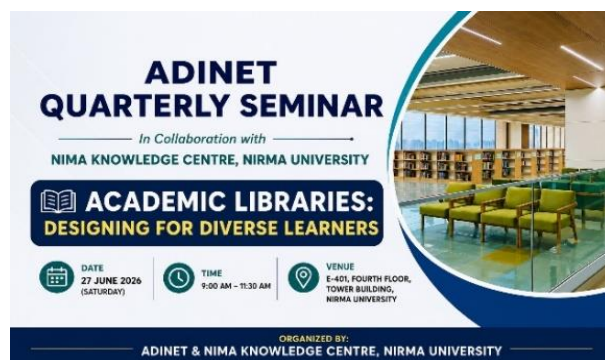

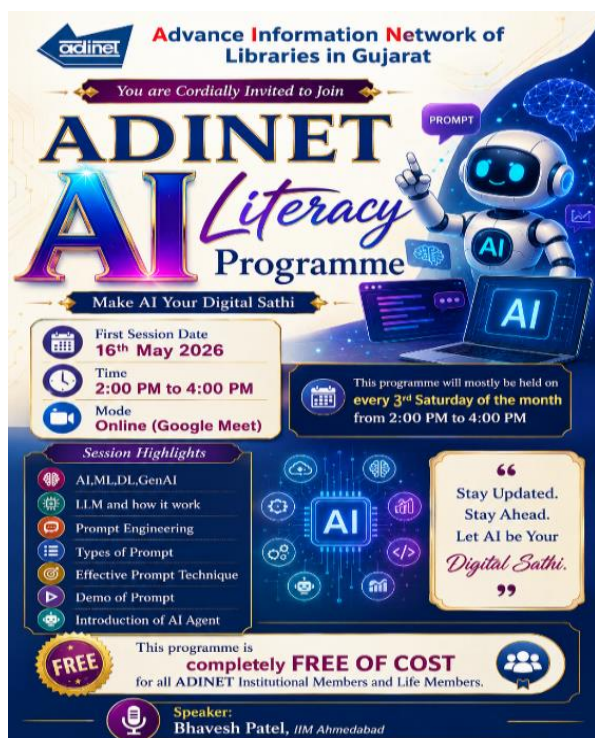
