ADINET'S SECONDARY RESEARCH ON PER CAPITA EXPENDITURE OF

LIBRARIES (2023-2024) IN GUJARAT AS PER NIRF 2025 RANKING : BY DR. SHAILESH YAGNIK, HON. DIRECTOR, ADINET

Libraries are the backbone of academic institutions for study and research. One of the reasons students join good institutions is due to their quality libraries, like IIM-A, IIT-G, SVNIT, MICA, PDEU, etc. It helps improve grades, get a placement, win competitions, add to their knowledge, bridge the knowledge gap, easily defeat the fear of not knowing, and increase confidence, etc. The library provides references from Scopus and Web of Science, and the best cited papers.

It increases the quality of research, helps in publishing in leading and qualitative journals.

The National Institute of Ranking Framework has recently released the data for the year 2023-24 in the 2025 rankings. Once researchers have the data, multiple analyses can be conducted.

ADINET has used some metadata from NIRF to conduct 2025 secondary research to determine per capita expenditure on libraries. This metadata covers aspects such as education categories, institution name, library, rank, budget, UG, PG, full-time PhD students, part-time PhD students, teachers, and actual

library expenditure. Gujarat has appeared in 11 academic categories out of the 17 categories in NIRF. Thirty institutions in Gujarat have performed among the top 100, 50, 40, 10, and 3 out of a total of 936 institutions in the NIRF rankings.

Four institutions have appeared multiple times due to the nature of their programs. There are 21 institutions that have appeared only once. IIT Gandhinagar has appeared in the Overall, Research Institutions, and Engineering categories. Gujarat University has appeared in the State Public University and University categories. PDEU has appeared in Engineering and Management. Nirma University has appeared in Architecture & Planning and Management. In the top ten, there are only

three institutions: IIM Ahmedabad in Management, Gujarat National Law University in Law, and CEPT University in Architecture and Planning.

The total amount spend by these libraries is ₹46,49,76,222.00 crore for 3494 users. The top ten libraries' total actual spend was ₹36,05,49,577.00 crore. Nine libraries have spent more than one crore rupees, and only one library has spent less than a crore

rupees. Engineering and management cover 60% of the institutions, with the

remaining four being law, medical, pharmacy, and university.

Institutions that value quality education and research always support libraries. Each library is known for its approach to users, ambiance, and services to the community. IIM Ahmedabad Library has been ranked number one in per capita expenditure at ₹104196.97 on the library. It is also ranked number one in the management category. The IIM Ahmedabad Library provides vital support to students, researchers, and

faculty, and also offers membership to provide maximum support to academia. The MICA Library is ranked third in per capita spending on the library. It is a premium institute in the areas of marketing, communication, and creativity, and also offers membership to academia. The IRMA Library and PDEU Library have spent ₹20797.75 and ₹14503.35 respectively. The IRMA Library is known for its collection in rural

management and marketing areas, while the PDEU Library focuses on energy, which is vital for business development. IIT Gandhinagar has ranked fourth in per capita expenditure on the library. IIT Gandhinagar Library's actual spending on the library is the second-highest after IIM Library, but per capita expenditure-wise, it is fourth due to their various programs and the strength of students. Similarly, SVNIT is third in library expenditure, but due to various programs and the strength of students, it ranked ninth in per capita expenditure on the library.

Cancer is a life-threatening disease, and research is being conducted internationally. The Gujarat Cancer Research Institute is spending ₹76,557.10 for each user, and they have 176 users. The NIPERA Library and GTU Library are ranked fifth and tenth, respectively, in per capita

expenditure in the pharmacy category. The GNLU Library specializes in law collections and is ranked seventh in per capita expenditure on libraries.

Overall, few management, engineering, medical, pharmacy, and law libraries in Gujarat are investing a good amount for their users. We can see the positive outcomes of this investment in education. However, if we view it as a cost, then library users, students, researchers, faculty, and the institution's reputation and ranking will suffer. These numbers provide valuable insights for future strategies for libraries and institutions to enhance their performance and generate comparative ideas. Without adequate per capita expenditure on libraries, institutes can run programs but may struggle to establish a strong presence and reputation in the education world.

LIBRARIANS' DAY 2025: ONE DAY NATIONAL SEMINAR ON "SUSTAINABLE LIBRARIES FOR SUSTAINABLE RURAL FUTURES"

Librarians' Day 2025, jointly organized by

ADINET and IRMA on 23rd August 2025 at the IRMA Auditorium, was a meaningful celebration of the theme "Sustainable Libraries for Sustainable Rural Futures." The IRMA community, especially the Ravi J. Matthai Library team, extended a warm and wholehearted welcome to all delegates. The day began with the lighting of the lamp and Saraswati Vandana, followed by a well-received welcome address by Ms. Sangita Bhatt, whose communication skills set

the tone for the seminar. Ms. Hiral Gadhvi beautifully and effortlessly anchored the post inauguration session.



Dr. Shailesh Yagnik, Hon. Director, ADINET, in his address, stressed the need to remain relevant, listen to young minds, and contribute as knowledge workers. Prof. Saswata N. Biswas, Director, IRMA, highlighted that libraries have shaped what we are today. Prof. H. S. Shylendra from IRMA reflected on the continuing relevance of libraries, the importance of rural youth engagement, and the balance between technology and human touch.

The keynote speaker, Prof. Devika Madalli, Director, INFLIBNET, inspired participants with the message that while many enter the profession by chance, they embrace it as destiny. She emphasized instilling reading and writing skills in rural communities and promoting content in local languages. Shri. Sunil S. Saluja, Directorate of Libraries, Gandhinagar, joined as Guest of Honour, and Dr. Saurabh K. Prajapati, Librarian, IRMA, delivered the vote of thanks. A major highlight of the inauguration was the successful launch of ADINET's AI-Chatbot.

The technical sessions and panel discussions were rich in insights. **In the first session**, Mr. Chetan A. Patel spoke on bridging knowledge gaps in rural areas, while Dr. Vallari Hathi discussed inclusiveness in libraries. Dr. Lavji Zala delivered an invited talk on community engagement and reaching the unreached. A panel moderated by Dr. Nimesh Oza brought together experts including Ms. Anubha Arora, Mr. Shivam Moradia, Dr. Sanjay Banavar, Dr. Banka Bihari Chand, and Shri. Sunil Saluja, who emphasized sustainability, rural outreach. There is a strong need to forward six resolutions to the Government in the spirit of Viksit Bharat 2047. Prof. Sushanta Sarma from IRMA, in his special talk on leadership, encouraged participants to archive the story of libraries, embrace inevitable change, practice effective listening, and be recognized by their name rather than their place.

The second technical session explored library trends and technology.

Mr. Mallikarjun and Dr. Lavji Zala presented their research on tracking LIS studies through a single journal. Shri. Sunil Saluja highlighted the growth and role of rural public libraries in Gujarat, while Mr. Bhavesh Patel shared innovations and tools for rural libraries.

The third session, chaired by Dr. Lalitha Poluru and Dr. Vallari Hathi, focused on empowering libraries and librarians. Dr. Kruti J. Trivedi spoke on rural knowledge networks and SDGs, Dr. Kannan P. explained digital transformation and sustainability through the metaphor of “Library as a Tree,” Dr. Miteshkumar Pandya emphasized skills and employability, and Mr. Shubham Bhatt discussed libraries and lifelong learning for rural communities.

Poster presentations by students of the PG Department of Library and Information Science, Sardar Patel University, Anand, added youthful energy. Their seven posters on “Community Engagement in Libraries through Digital Information Literacy” showcased government schemes and creative ideas for rural engagement. ONLINE WORKSHOP ON “AI APPLICATIONS IN LIBRARIES”: A REPORT: BY DR. MITESH PANDYA

Overview

ADINET organized a five-week online workshop on “AI Applications in Libraries” to help library professionals, researchers, and LIS students explore the practical applications of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in library services. The workshop ran from July 05 to August 02, 2025, with sessions conducted every Saturday from 10:30 AM to 12:00 Noon. The event received an enthusiastic response, with 59 participants from across India, including university librarians, library professionals,

LIS faculty members, and research

scholars. The workshop aimed to enhance digital literacy, familiarize participants with AI-driven tools, and demonstrate the integration of intelligent systems in library operations.

Objectives

- To introduce the fundamentals of Artificial Intelligence and its relevance to library science.
- To demonstrate the use of AI-based tools for cataloguing, metadata management, and user engagement.
- To provide hands-on exposure to developing chatbots and agentic AI applications for libraries.
- To promote collaboration and innovation in adopting AI for next-generation library services.

- Strengthened professional collaboration and capacity for digital transformation.

Conclusion

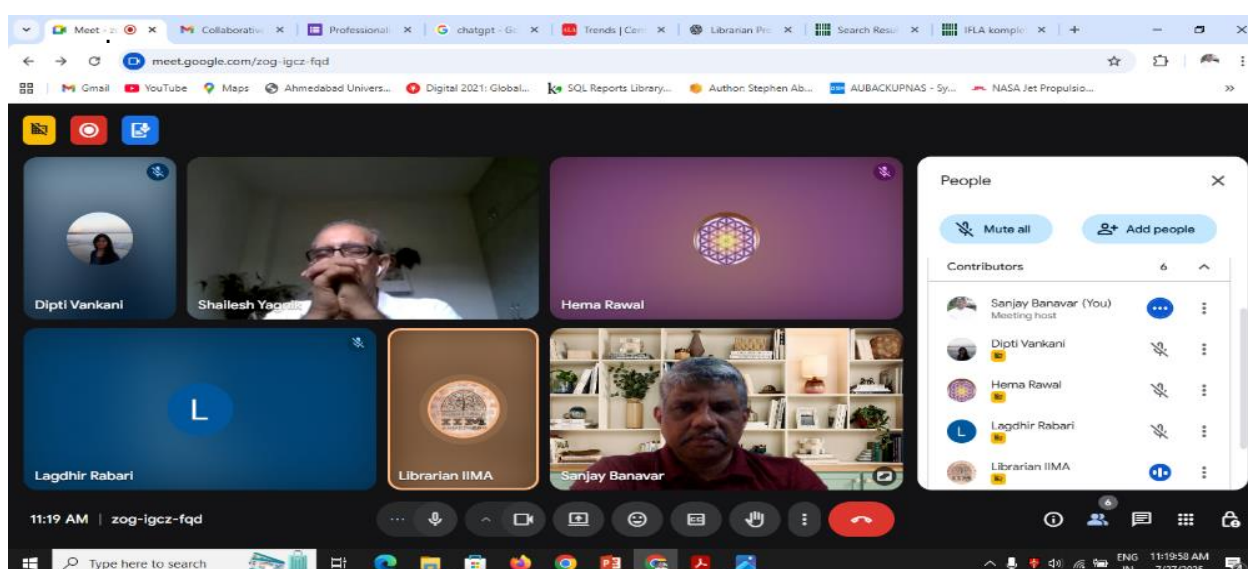

**ADINET - COLLABORATIVE WISDOM
ONLINE WEBINAR: A REPORT:**

In this quarter, ADINET continued its Collaborative Wisdom series with two

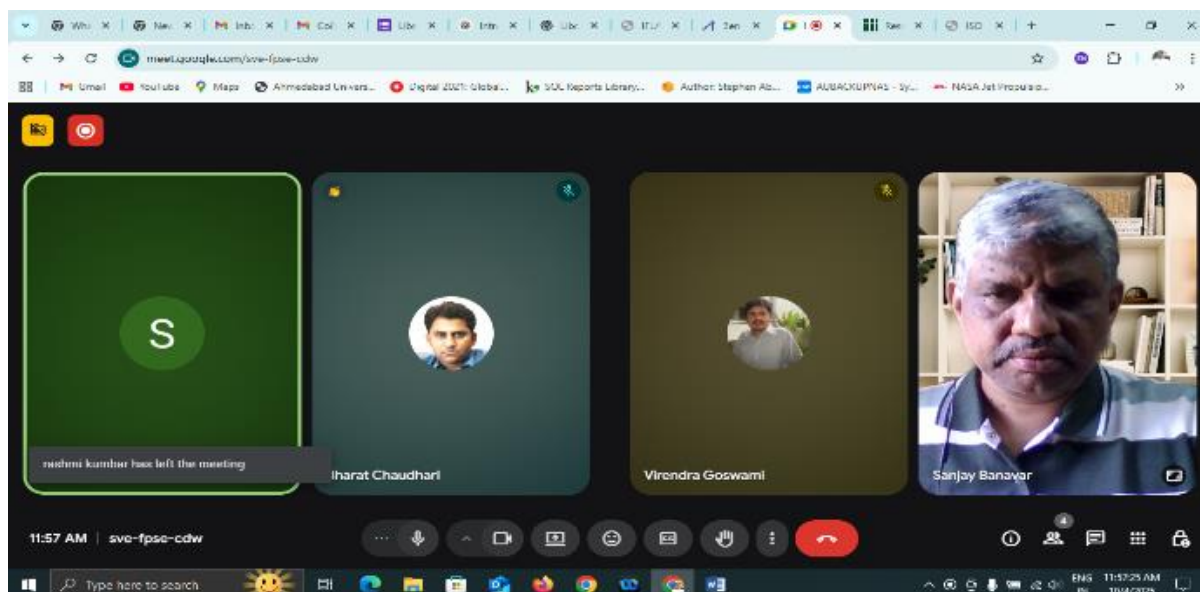
thought-provoking sessions. On July 27, 2025, the discussion on “Professionalism in Practice: Strengthening the Librarian’s Image through Strategic Services” brought together seven participants who engaged in a rich conversation on redefining professionalism within libraries. The session began with the observation that many librarians hesitate to assert their professional identity or align their work with institutional strategies, which often limits their visibility and influence. Participants emphasized that true professionalism goes beyond routine work. It involves strategic

engagement with faculty, participation in institutional events, and developing services that directly support organizational goals. As one speaker noted, “We must treat our library services as strategic assets and communicate their value in measurable ways.” The session also highlighted the need for librarians to adopt a market-oriented mindset, equating the library’s contribution to a “return on investment” for the institution, thereby making its impact both visible and quantifiable.



The following session, held on October 4, 2025, focused on “Library Statistics and Data Management” and also saw participation from seven professionals. The discussion centered on the role of accurate data in demonstrating library performance and supporting evidence-based decisions. Participants reflected on how many libraries collect statistics on usage, collections, and services but often fail to analyze or present them effectively.

It was agreed that systematic data management not only aids in performance assessment and resource planning but also helps libraries showcase their contribution to institutional outcomes. By transforming raw statistics into meaningful insights, libraries can better advocate for funding, plan services aligned with user needs, and enhance their strategic value within the organization.

Viksit Bharat:

ADINET aims to contribute to national development by creating structured information for optimal resource utilization on Viksit Bharat. The budget for 2024-25 was based on Viksit Bharat. A knowledge structure with 12 metadata has been created, incorporating information from Government of

India websites with links for primary sources. An online directory with access to 6863 websites is provided. Additionally, thirty-seven international organizations are included for comparison with different nations. The presentation covers 103 budget items. Shri P.K. Laheri and Dr. Ravindra Dholokia have provided qualitative inputs to enhance the quality of presentation. You are encouraged to share this information for educational and research purposes. The presentation has been sent to the Finance Minister, Vice Chairman and CEO of NITI Aayog for their input and support.

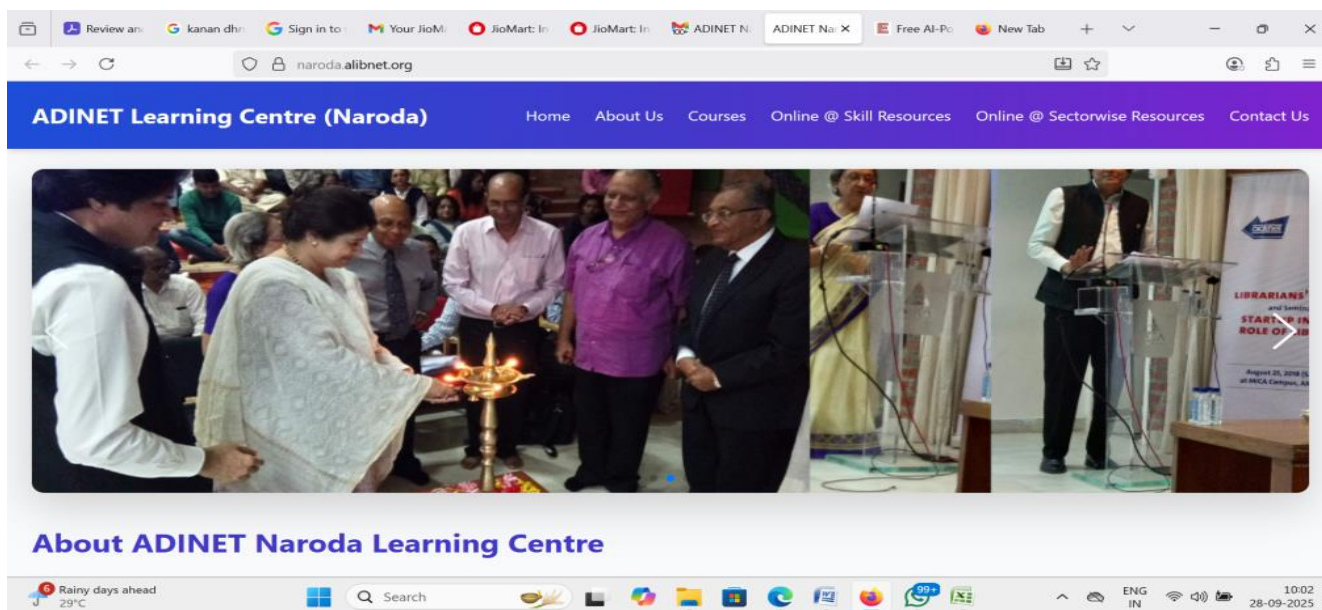
